

Washable KAINUU GREY SHEEPSKIN



This sheepskin is produced at Puustila Scenic Farm in Ilomantsi, Finland. We are raising Kainuu Gray sheep to value and maintain the locally significant hilly landscape. During the summer season the sheep graze on organic arable, meadows and woodland pastures.

Kainuu Gray Sheep is a native Finnish breed that almost became extinct in 1980's. This rare breed is still nowadays poorly known. Kainuu Gray sheep's wool occurs in various gray tones from almost white to nearly black. Also, some brown tones can exist - though it is very rare.



USE

The wool of Kainuu Gray sheep is particularly soft and very suitable against the skin. The sheepskin may be used in various places as on seats, beds, car seats, prams, sledges, bedroom floors or other similar places where you are in need of warmth and softness.

The length of the wool is good to choose depending on the use. The shorter the hair, the better the abrasion resistance.

CARE

Care for your sheepskin by airing, shaking and brushing. The wool is naturally dirt-repellent and fresh stains can be removed by rinsing out or rubbing out with absorbent cloth e.g. a cotton cloth. The wool friendly stain removers or soda can be used additionally. Do not rub hard or soak.

WASH & DRY

This sheepskin can be washed with water: pressing by hand avoiding rubbing or in the washing machine with wool wash program at a maximum of 30 Celsius degrees. Use the wool wash or other mild detergent (Y3).

Flat dry the sheepskin on an airy surface e.g. a drying rack: stretch and shape when damp. While drying or other ways in humid or wet circumstances the sheepskin should not be left against a solid surface due to risk of mold or mildew.
